- Prepare them for life after Year 12

Three core strands to the curriculum:

- English
- Science

Statutory Subjects (not assessed)

- Religious Education
- Learning for Life and Work

Optional Subjects

- Personal choice based on personal strengths and chosen career pathway
- 2-4 subjects

- GCSE courses and GCSE equivalent courses
- Controlled Assessment, Portfolio-assessed and Examinations

- Separate option blocks -Four in Pathway 1, Two in Pathway 2.
- Students must choose a set number of GCSEs and a set number of GCSE equivalent courses based on their band
- Completed at home

Stage 1 - Expression of Interest 1

Options Afternoon

- > Talk to **specialist teachers** about the range of subjects on offer.
- Use the time to ask important questions.
- Tonight, look at the booklet again when everything is fresh in your mind.
- > Complete the skills, qualities and careers tables on the form.

After Options Afternoon

- > First Expression of Interest form to be completed.
- This will be done in LLW lessons with further guidance, but the forms will go home for consultation.
- > Students should indicate the three (V band)/ four (H and L band) subjects that they think they would like to study and should do this in order of preference with 1 being the subject they wish to study the most.

Stage 2 - Expression of Interest 2

- A second Expression of Interest form will be given to students after Christmas.
- At this point, students will have been placed on either **Pathway 1 and 2** (Baseline data and internal assessment used to inform this as well as conversations with parents/carers, if required).
- Students will be encouraged to choose a set number of GCSEs and a set number of GCSE equivalent courses depending on their band, H, L or V.
- Students will indicate the subjects they believe they would like to study, again, ranking them with 1 being their most preferred.
- ▶ Please note, students do not need to choose the same subjects that they chose at stage 1. Preferences may change as they move further into year 10 and learn more about their subjects.
- Options booklets should be referred to again during this process.

Pathways





Includes a range of **both academic** and vocational qualifications.

Suited to students whose preferred learning style suits assessment through examination and coursework.

Facilitates progression onto Sixth Form and University and well as FE and Employment.





Pathway 2

An alternative pathway suited to students who **perform better** through the **applied curriculum** and **project based work.**

Students must study GCSE English, GCSE Mathematics and Science.

Facilitates progression on to Further Education and Employment.

Purpose of Stages 1 & 2

- Encourages thinking throughout year 10 about optional subject choices.
- Inform the Staffing and Timetabling structure within the College.
- Curriculum offer is decided based on student feedback in these two stages.
- Optional blocks for students to make their final option choices are designed based on this feedback with the aim of allowing them to access as many of their choices as possible.

Stage 3 - Final Optional Subject Choices

- This is where students submit their final choice for their optional subjects.
- Option booklets should be referred to again during this process.
- This stage of the process will be carried out using option blocks.
- Students will be encouraged to choose a set number of GCSEs and a set number of GCSE equivalent courses depending on their band, H, L or V.
- > This stage will be carried out in March 2024.

Option Blocks

As previously stated, students will choose their options subjects within the pathway that is most suitable for them.

- Subjects are offered in four option blocks in Pathway 1 and two option blocks in Pathway 2 (additional courses then provided).
- The arrangement of the option blocks will be created based on your feedback in Stages 1 and 2.
- The options blocks will offer a breadth of choice in terms of both content and level, and will allow for various career and education pathways.

How to use Option Blocks

Students must choose a first and second choice in each of the option blocks.

Do not choose the same subject as your first choice in 2 or more blocks.

In some cases, students may not be awarded their first choice and will be placed in their second. Therefore, it is important that students carefully consider their second choice.

Making Choices



Choosing Subjects

Don't choose subjects based on:

- What your friend is choosing.
- Liking/not liking the teacher.
- > Because a sibling studied the subject in the past.
- > Finding it easy in years 8-10.
- > Thinking it is a "bit of a laugh".



Choosing Subjects

Do choose subjects because:

- You are good at the subject (as your tracking grades show).
- > You **enjoy** the subject.
- The subject matches your skills and qualities.
- > You are considering a career in a related area.
- > You have considered **current labour market trends** STEM based subjects, for example.
- > You like the method(s) of **assessment** used.
- You are most likely to achieve 5+A*-C grades.



Supporting Your Child

- Role of Careers advice at this stage is essential.
- Students should listen to the advice of the school:
 - Specialist teachers
 - > LLW lessons
 - > Options booklet
- > Attendance is essential for success.
- Take time to talk at home about career paths, job opportunities and the strengths of your children as well as looking at the Options booklet together.


