### Dear Parent/Carer

We hope your child enjoyed the Freshers' BBQ and met a few people from their Form Class. This will hopefully make beginning Year 8 slightly less daunting.

First day for Year 8 pupils in Laurelhill Community College will be Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> August from 9.00am – 12noon. Second day for Year 8 pupils is Friday 1<sup>st</sup> September 9.00am – 12noon. These two days are for Year 8 pupils only.

- Pupils should wear full school uniform, please see list, and bring a bag containing a snack, drink and a pencil case.
- There will be no Canteen or buses on these days.
- During Thursday 31st August and Friday 1st September your child will be completing computer testing and should bring headphones compatible with PCs (wireless/Bluetooth headphones will not be acceptable).
- Our Canteen uses a Fingerprint system. If you do not wish your child to be fingerprinted, please send a note stating this to their Form Tutor and they will be given a code instead.

Parents are asked to attend an information morning on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> September 11.00am – 12noon when they can meet key staff and become familiar with our school routines and procedures.

All year groups will return to school on Monday 4th September which is a full school day from 9.00am - 3.00pm. Canteen and buses will be available. Please note Year 8 students will be permitted to leave school at 2.55pm for this first week.

If any problems arise during this induction period or subsequently in the school year please contact the Form Tutor who is directly responsible for your child's welfare. Problems requiring further attention will be directed, by the Form Tutor, to Mrs Rea (Head of Yr8 Girls), Mrs Scott (Head of Yr8 Boys), Mrs Beckett (Senior Teacher, Pastoral) or Mr Dane (Deputy Principal responsible for Pastoral Care throughout the College).

# What should I bring?

Firstly bring yourself - make sure you arrive on time!

As you can see each period lasts for 30 minutes. On some occasions you may even have a triple period for one subject but usually your day will consist of double and single periods.

#### MY TIMETABLE

### MY FORM TUTOR AND HEAD OF YEAR

The most important person who you will get to know is your class's special teacher or FORM TUTOR. They are responsible for your welfare and progress and he/she will be the first person you will meet each morning during Registration time at 9.00am.

Your tutor will monitor your attendance, punctuality, uniform, behaviour and homework.

It is your Form Tutor who will attempt to keep your parents informed about your performance in classwork and Christmas/Summer examinations.

Your Form Tutor is the main link between your home and college.

#### DAILY ROUTINE

### (A TYPICAL DAY!)

## What time should you arrive?

This may depend on whether you walk to college, get a lift or arrive by bus. A good habit is to set yourself the target of being five minutes early. In other words if Registration is at 9.00am be at your form room for 8.55am.

One morning each week you will have a Year Assembly for all Year 8 pupils in the Assembly Hall. You are expected to listen carefully and behave in an orderly fashion before and after assembly.

## What happens if I need to leave early?

Permission to leave college can only be given if you bring a properly signed note from your parent/guardian or they phone the College Office. You must show parent's notes, appointment cards for doctors, dentists etc to your Form Tutor. Notes will be signed by Form Tutor and you should show this to the College Office before you leave. Please try to make appointments 'after' college hours as far as it is humanly possible.

## If for some reason I happen to be late!

Report immediately to your Form Tutor and explain why; otherwise you will be marked absent. If you arrive after 9.15am again you must report to your Form Tutor.

### If I am absent!

When you return to College a note explaining your absence should be sent in by your parents and given to your Form Tutor.

### If I'm unwell!

Again you should first visit your Form Tutor. Where necessary they will contact a parent if it is felt that you need to go home. It is important that the college has your most current emergency contact numbers. Please inform the college of any changes.

### What happens at break and lunch time?

During morning break which will be from 10.15am to 10.30am you can go into the playground. You will have the opportunity to use the Library and you might also like to visit our Dining Hall for a quick mid morning snack.

Remember an orderly queue is expected and all litter must find its way into the bins provided. Laurelhill is your college and we expect you to be proud of its appearance. Our concern for the environment must begin within this college.

#### Lunches

If you bring a packed lunch you can eat it in the seated areas.

The college operates a Cafeteria system which is very popular with pupils and staff. Our Canteen uses a Fingerprint system. This allows pupils to load money onto their account at machines throughout the college and pay for their food using their fingerprint. If you do not wish your child to be fingerprinted, please send a note stating this and they will be given a code instead.

Pupils entitled to free-dinners will be provided with a meal to the value of a specified amount per day.

## **Lunchtime Supervision**

You will notice adult supervisors who have been appointed to assist with the organisation of the lunch period. They should be given due respect and courtesy.

#### **Buses**

All pupils using public transport are expected to display good manners and courtesy at all times. When waiting for a bus pupils must form an orderly queue and have a bus pass or correct fare ready for the driver. Misbehaviour on buses is considered to be a serious offence and may result in disciplinary action.

Parents should apply for **Free School Meals** and a **Bus Pass** via EA website. Arrangements from Primary School do not roll over to Year 8.

#### Homework

Homework should assist you to learn. During your first year you will have homework to do and the reason why we give you a Laurelhill College diary is to help you organise your homeworks. Please use it and get into the good habit of recording the homework set in your diary on the date it has to be submitted to your teacher. So, when it comes to packing your schoolbag do not forget your diary. It will be checked and signed by your Form Tutor at least once every week. We also expect a parent to sign your diary once per week.

## What will my homeworks consist of?

Homework will be of various types e.g. research, written, reading, learning, drawing or making something. A homework timetable is organised so that you will not be given too many homeworks on any one evening.

When you get a homework we expect it to be completed carefully and accompanied by a parent's/guardian's signature. If you genuinely cannot do a homework please explain this to your subject teacher and bring a note from home, indicating the problem.

All homework is of equal importance and should be presented as neatly as possible. Remember to show it to your parents.

# **COLLEGE UNIFORM**

#### COLLEGE RULES

Our rules are not too strict. We stress respectful behaviour, full college uniform worn correctly and attention and courtesy to all members of staff.

**BEHAVIOUR** We expect a high standard of behaviour at Laurelhill

#### REMEMBER

To treat others as you would like to be treated. To be honest in all you say and do. To respect others and their property. There is never an excuse for bad manners.

- Each pupil attending this college will be given the opportunity to progress to the best of his/her ability. Any pupils who acts in a manner which interferes with the progress of other pupils will be subject to the college's disciplinary procedures.
- A strong emphasis is placed on pupils' identification with the college's values and also on pupils' personal appearance. Unless specifically instructed otherwise, complete college uniform must be worn by pupils to and from college, to all college functions including games, on college visits, and during the sitting of external examinations.
- Pupils are required to behave responsibly, to display good manners and to show consideration and respect for other pupils and adults. This applies not only in school but also when travelling to and from college.
- Every pupil is expected to complete homeworks on time and to be properly prepared for work in class at all times.
- Pupils are expected to attend college regularly and punctually. A note from the parent/guardian is required on return after any period of absence. There are pages in your diary for this purpose.
- Pupils must not leave college during the course of the day without being granted permission from their Form Tutor and Head of Year.
- All personal property should carry clear identification marks. Such property includes text books, stationery and Physical Education kit.
- Blazers, bags and books must be free from graffiti. Pupils are responsible for the safe-keeping of their college books at all times.
- While the college will do everything possible to retrieve missing property of pupils it cannot hold itself responsible for making good the loss of

personal property. At no time should school bags be left outside classroom doors.

- When moving between classes pupils must walk at all times in an orderly fashion on the left-hand side of the corridor and follow the one way system.
- Packed lunches must be eaten in the areas provided.
- All litter should be disposed of carefully in the bins provided.
- Pupils who bring bicycles to college must ensure that they are left only in the areas provided and are secured by lock and chain.

A college is as good as you, the pupils, make it. We have built up a fine reputation in the community, so be a credit to your college at all times.
